## International Conference Report

*Special thanks to Revd Richard Cook for writing this report about The Power of Religion Conference which he recently attended.*

London Metropolitan University's Centre for the Study of Religion, Conflict and Cooperation arranged a 3 day conference with the challenging title, 'The Power of Religion: Towards Peace and Moderation or Violence and Extremism?'

The speakers, giving 8 keynote addresses and sitting on 4 Plenary Panels, were almost all highly qualified and capable communicators from Universities around the UK, and from overseas. The speakers were a wonderfully varied group, both male and female, from Jewish, Christian, Muslim, and secular backgrounds.

### **THE POWER OF RELIGION: Towards Peace and Moderation or Violence and Extremism?**

My four snapshots of the conference come from very different speakers.

**Professor Baroness Haleh Afshar** from York University described herself as a 3<sup>rd</sup> generation Muslim Feminist. She explored the crisis of identity felt by many Muslim women, and she wondered whether those Muslims who are dissidents or extremists are those who feel excluded.

**Fabio Petito**, from Sussex University, continued to focus on identity issues. Since the fall of the Berlin Wall, a new politics of identity has developed, in which religion, culture, ethnicity and civilization are all used to justify irrationality in international relations. Following the end of the European Wars of Religion, the only safe religion was a privatised religion. But in the modern era, politicised religions have emerged, often leading to violence. Paradoxically, this violence emerges from communities that are often weak doctrinally, and shallow in their understanding of the traditions of the faith.

**Tariq Ramadan**, from Oxford University, like several other speakers, observed the rise of 'DIY versions' of particular faith traditions. By definition, these are not rooted in a deep understanding of their texts and teaching. Nonetheless, authentic jihad is the proper route towards peace, when facing oppression and injustice. But this jihad may have to resist oppressive violence with violence, in order to introduce reform.

**Rabbi Dr. Marc Gopin**, from George Mason University, USA, spoke movingly of his involvement with conflict resolution in the Middle East and beyond. Working in Syria with a remarkable Christian woman, he had been able to encourage a culture of debate, when few other options seemed possible. He encouraged us to look for the vision of a new reality in which change is possible.

This was an inspiring conference, stretching our minds and raising our expectations for what our faith traditions could lead us to expect in our troubled world {

## Mental Health Strategy

I am at present working on a community engagement profile with Surrey County Council and the voluntary sector looking at Mental Health support services throughout Surrey. We are mapping out where support is already in place, such as lunch clubs, support groups, drop in centres, employment clubs, art and social groups etc. for those with mental health problems. The outcome is to identify what is already in place, what works and areas which are in need and require support.

In addition we will be holding workshop type events inviting all who have, cares for or are involved with mental health issues to ask them what they think would help. For those who cannot or who do not want to attend, a simple questionnaire will be available.

**Please could you take just a few minutes** to let us know if your church or faith community is running or accommodates any project for those who have, or supports, those with mental health problems?

We hope to complete the project by October/November; putting in place a realistic strategy for the future. We will also be able to communicate what services are established in your area and those which could be a project for the future which may include funding.

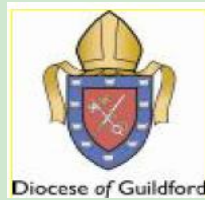

This conference is for parents/carers, people with autistic spectrum disorders (ASDs), professionals and others interested in autism and Asperger Syndrome. It will look at how parents and professionals can ensure that people with autistic spectrum disorders are given the right support to meet their individual needs:

- How to judge if a school or adult service is right for the person with ASD.
- How staff can adapt how they work to the different needs of individuals.
- How professionals and families can work together to help people with ASDs achieve their potential.

In the morning our speaker is **Prof Rita Jordan**, Emeritus Professor in Autism Studies. Her talk will include how parents can assess which schools can meet their child's needs, and how schools can cater for the individual needs of pupils within a mainstream or special school classroom.

In the afternoon **Dr Wendy Lawson** will talk about tailoring support to the needs of individual adults across the autism spectrum. Dr Lawson is a psychologist and writer who was diagnosed with Asperger Syndrome in her 40s, having previously been mis-diagnosed as schizophrenic and learning disabled.

Following this, two speakers from Surrey County Council will talk about the services that Surrey provides for adults with ASDs, how individual needs are taken into account and catered for, and how the Autism Partnership Board in Surrey will improve the lives of adults with ASDs. **Simon Laker** is Surrey's Senior Manager for Learning Disabilities Commissioning, and **Tom Moore** is Surrey's Autism Lead and Accommodation Project Manager.
