Preserving Surrey's Faith Heritage

Did you know that historical records of Surrey's diverse faiths are held at Surrey History Centre in Woking? Surrey History Centre, which

is part of Surrey County Council, opened in 1998 and is purpose-built for the storage and permanent preservation of the county's archives. A whole host of faiths feature in the collections but the Centre endeavours to make the collections more representative of Surrey's diversity. Currently, the Centre acts as the Diocesan record office for Surrey, holding Anglican parish records dating from the 1530's. It also holds a variety of other faith records, including Non-Conformist records dating back



to the 1660's, some Roman Catholic registers and records relating to the Shah Jahan Mosque.

Surrey History Centre is very keen to hear from other faith organisations who may wish to deposit their records for safekeeping. Records can be of any date and might include:



- · registers,
- newsletters,
- photographs,
- · publicity material and
- minutes of meetings.

Items can be loaned or given and are stored in proper archival conditions. Records are catalogued by an archivist and interested researchers can access the items in the Centre's supervised search room. A copy of the catalogue is made available on the Centre's website and can be accessed worldwide http://www.surreycc.gov.uk/surreyhistorycentre

New visitors to the Centre are always welcome whether to research family or local history, or who once lived in their house. Behind the scenes tours and talks to groups are available, as well as a whole series of events and family activities. Introducing Reverend Jan Moore: Faith Coordinator / Lead Chaplain for Surrey Police

I'm currently in my third year of office as the Faith Coordinator/Lead Chaplain for Surrey Police. I continue to focus on three main areas of work for Surrey Police:

- To further develop, maintain and coordinate a network of voluntary chaplains who provide a chaplaincy service to police stations and police work centres across the county
- To generate contacts and develop relationships with leaders and members of diverse faith communities across the county.
- To encourage faith communities into active relevant partnerships with the police.

What do Police Chaplains do?

Chaplains provide non-judgemental and confidential support to any member of Surrey Police whether they are of a particular faith or no faith at all. They are chosen for their listening skills, sensitivity, empathy and commitment. And they are people of prayer.

All the Chaplains are vetted and trained by Surrey Police. I'm pleased to tell you that Surrey Police now has 21 volunteer chaplains who each offer between 4-8 hours per month. Between them they currently represent 6 different faiths and 4 different Christian denominations., but this is expanding all the time.

The Greatest Challenge

The biggest challenge lies in bringing faith communities into active relevant partnership with police. What might you have noticed or not noticed in your area upon which you could <u>act</u> as a 'saving' activity. For example:

- saving the police from some of their load, in a time when their resources are stretched.
- saving a vulnerable individual or group from getting caught up in crime.
- saving other vulnerable individuals or groups from becoming the victims of crime.

Part of our 'big society' is about taking local responsibility. It is often the case that the local police will have a much better notion of how that sense of responsibility could be usefully channelled. Your local Safer Neighbourhood Team would be pleased to hear from you.

Training new Police Officers in Faith Understanding

Another aspect of the Chaplaincy's work is to facilitate training for Student Police Officers regarding faith knowledge and understanding. This is important to Surrey Police so that the behaviours, culture, traditions and beliefs of individuals are considered, if at all possible, when police are on operational duties. If you have any concerns that Surrey Police have not delivered a sensitive service in this regard, again please do not hesitate to contact me. I will be pleased to hear those concerns, in order to improve the service. I am also happy to be invited to speak at faith group events.


