The young people they encounter are often young, hungry, bored and thrive from the positive environment created by our youth specialists.

### Free Early Education for Two Year Olds

Funding for free early education for two year olds can be applied for by completing a parent application. There is a criteria for funding (see leaflet: [http://www.surreycc.gov.uk/\\_\\_data/assets/pdf\\_file/0006/816270/Item-13-FEET\\_2014-A4-Web-version.pdf](http://www.surreycc.gov.uk/__data/assets/pdf_file/0006/816270/Item-13-FEET_2014-A4-Web-version.pdf)) and if a family are eligible they will receive confirmation from the FEET team in writing.

Families who qualify will be able to send their two year old to pre-school, nursery or to a childminder and be funded for 15 hours a week, over 38 weeks a year (term-time only). A child qualifies from the term after they are two and funding is available for three terms until they move into the universal entitlement for all 3/4 year olds to have free early education.

Once funding has been agreed it will not be withdrawn, even if their circumstances change. FEET funding will not affect any other benefits you receive.

Epsom & Ewell Citizens Advice has over 80 skilled volunteers who can help local citizens with the problems of hard times including: Benefits, Consumer Issues, Debt, Employment, Housing, Redundancy and Relationships

Mary Frances Trust was established in 1994 to provide a place where people living with mental health problems are welcome and feel that they belong. We are the lead provider for the Community Connections service in Mole Valley and Epsom and Ewell. Our main focus is on people's

well being and to support them to become fully active members of their community. Services provided include;

**Advice and support:** with housing, debt and benefits, as well as support to attend meetings, deal with agencies and referrals to other organisations if required.

**Learning and skills:** support to access training courses and volunteering positions.

**Computer sessions:** one to one eDCC sessions as well as informal sessions.

Complementary therapies: low cost therapies provided in Leatherhead and Epsom.

**Self Help groups:** Three separate facilitated groups each held once a month covering anxiety, bi-polar and hoarding.

**Group activities:** art group, play reading, discussion group.

**Taster courses:** singing, crafts, de-cluttering, stress management, cooking and others.

**Drop in days:** at Leatherhead Clubhouse on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and at the Brickfield Centre in Epsom on Wednesdays and Fridays. People using the service at both centres go shopping and help prepare the lunch and at the Clubhouse help run the house.

## FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

### Surrey County Council's Community Improvement Fund

The Community Improvements Fund for 14/15 is now open to applicants. The fund has been set up to support local community based initiatives which make a real difference to people's lives. Bids to the fund can be submitted for requests between £10,000 and £30,000 until 25 July 2014. The funding is intended primarily to cover capital costs linked to community infrastructure projects.

The project must meet each of the specific criteria to be eligible to apply to the fund:

- \* Improving community facilities
- \* Wider community benefit
- \* Making a real difference to people's lives
- \* Encouraging communities to take greater responsibility for local issues and encourage people to work together

### Surrey Community Building Grants Scheme 2015-2016

The Surrey Community Buildings Scheme is a partnership scheme jointly funded by Surrey County Council and the district and borough councils. It is administered by Surrey Community Action currently all boroughs/districts are participating with the exception of Epsom & Ewell and Waverley, The Scheme offers capital grants to village halls, community centres and voluntary youth buildings subject to their meeting certain specified criteria.

Grants are available towards the following types of project:-

- providing new community buildings
- extensions to existing buildings
- provision of disability access and facilities
- major structural work
- major refurbishment to hall, kitchens, toilets etc
- unforeseen urgent repairs such as re-wiring or re-roofing
- provision of car parking

Special consideration will be given to applications which are made in order to comply with The Disability Discrimination Act 2004 (Part 3).

Applications with projects costing less than £10,000 in total will not be considered. Grants are not available towards general maintenance work, such as redecorating.

Priority will be given to those projects used by a wide variety of community groups at all times of the day and those that show a sustainable usage of the building.

Applications are invited from 1st April 2013 and must be submitted by 31st August 2014, with a decision expected by 1st April 2015. The project must be capable of being completed by 31st March 2016.
