EHRC guidance on religion and belief in the workplace

In February the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) published guidance on religion and belief in the workplace based on the judgements in January of the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR) on the four combined cases (Ladele, McFarlane, Eweida, and Chaplin) on religious freedom.

The judgements affect the responsibilities of employers to put in place policies to protect religion or belief rights in the workplace both for the rights of employees and the rights of customers. While the cases were brought exclusively by Christians the implications of the judgement apply to employees of any religion or belief, including those of non-religious beliefs.

On 14 February the Government launched a faith based social action initiative called 'Together in Service' (TiS), which follows on from the 'A Year

of Service' programme held during 2012. Speaking at the launch of the Jubilee+ organisation's National Church and Social Action Survey, Baroness Warsi said: "Our faith groups make a huge contribution to society with an army of dedicated volunteers who commit their time and enthusiasm throughout the year. I'm thrilled to announce Together in Service today to build on this excellent work."

TiS is a 3 year programme, designed to motivate new social action work, especially multi-faith volunteering projects, and to celebrate all the social action that faith communities already undertake. It will be based around an on-going monthly calendar of faith-based volunteering, supported by a

'fellowship' of active volunteers and A Together in Service small-grants fund to encourage new multi faith social action projects in areas where there may be a lack of confidence or knowledge in undertaking volunteering work in a multi-faith way. The fund will be financed by contributions from faith communities with DCLG match-funding on a 1:1 basis, up to a maximum of £100,000 per annum.

In addition to the match-funding for grants DCLG will offer £50,000 per annum in total grant to the organisation or partnership of organisations at national level that is selected to develop the programme, in consultation with the faith communities, following a tendering process. It is expected that this will be opened shortly and that the programme will be operational by late Spring.

Is Woking becoming a Sustainable Town?

The third Woking Debate held on Saturday 16 March 2013

Over 60 people attended this debate including the Mayor and Jonathan Lord, MP and was ably chaired by Ruth Breddal.

Ray Morgan, the Woking Chief Executive, introduced the topic with a witty, informed and challenging talk, emphasising that these were his own views, not necessarily the Council's. As a country we consume so much that it would take four earths to sustain us if everyone in the planet was to live at our level of consumption. How do we then make a community sustainable? "You make them poorer". At present we are a self consuming, self centred society and we cannot continue like this.

He asked school children about their vision. They want a sustainable community where all people can live without fear. A more equal society where we spend more on the less fortunate.

"Our consumption level is absurd".

How do we become more sustainable? Wind turbines, thermal energy. How do we use our spaces and homes in a different way?

Jonathon Lord defended the Right to buy scheme as having created mixed communities and the Government's efforts to control immigration which will lead to an easing of the housing shortage. He reminded people of the Government's Green Deal – which gives loans so people can reduce their energy bills – to be paid out of future energy savings. He believed that the Government was getting a better balance between central government and local government with its localism policy which Ray Morgan broadly agreed with.

Jonathon asked Ray how the Council runs with such a strong Chief Executive? Ray said he had been described as a megalomaniac and even been referred to as Hitler. As the Chief Executive he thought it was important to point out to the Council implications and possible shortcomings in their plans and present alternatives. He believed passionately in the need to create a sustainable environment and to work towards a fairer society but he would only be in post for as long as the Council supports him and at the end of the day he is bound to follow out their instructions.

Mohammed said how he had moved his business and his home from Guildford to Woking attracted by the dynamism that Woking is showing with many important companies setting up offices here.

The next Woking Debate will be on Saturday 20th April 2013 at Christ Church, when Rev John McCabe and a young person will introduce the topic *Where will our children live? Woking?*

Faithful Providers Report

Demos has published a report entitled Faithful Providers, in response to the Government's White Paper on Open Public Services. The report, which investigates 20 faith-motivated organisations across a variety of policy areas, argues that local authorities stand to benefit both financially and through improved community relations if religious groups are brought into service delivery. It also argues that, if religious groups in receipt of public money were to be required to work with organisations of other faiths when delivering services, the result could be improved integration, a greater sense of community and stronger local institutions. It suggests that local authorities should cease to view commissioning as purely an economic decision, and instead consider the added social value that charitable and faith providers bring.

- Supporting young people and/or vulnerable people
- Preserving local history and educating residents about their area
- Providing and documenting opportunities for disabled people
- Providing information which improves the quality of life for residents in their local community

The Speak Up Film Fund is keen to support projects which promote existing good practice, and the inspiring work of the many organisations around the UK, helping them to celebrate their achievements with the widest possible audience.

Your Film

The application form below requires you to submit a short film proposal, and some supporting information about your organisation and it's work. Don't panic though - you don't have to have any prior experience in filmmaking or marketing!

For these applications we are solely interested in the story your organisation has to tell, and the quality of your initial film ideas. We will work with successful applicants to develop their ideas into film projects which are creative, practical and affordable whilst meeting all of their intended outcomes.

The Prizes

This year, the fund is slightly different. Successful applicants will receive a contribution of 50% of the cost of a film package from the Community Film Unit. This year, there are three different packages on offer to applicants - Amethyst, Emerald and Ruby. Details of each package are provided below.
